

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Learning Together- Getting ready for school

As a parent or family member you are your child's first and most important educators. The support you give your children has an enormous influence on their achievements. When children know their teachers and parents are interested, they are more likely to be successful learners.

Learning at home

Learning these skills will make a real difference to your child before starting school:

- Recognising their name
- Recognising letters and numbers in the environment
- Singing lots of songs and rhymes
- Listening games- What can you hear?
- Drawing, colouring, making and any physical activity
- Talking about thoughts and feelings
- Sharing books
- Encouraging your child to have a go at something new and develop independence (doing things for themselves)
- Dressing and undressing independently
- Holding a pair of scissors to cut along straight and wavy lines

Remember to praise your child for everything they attempt, even if they don't get it right first time.

Useful Skills

When your child starts school it would be helpful if they could do these things

- Take off their coat and hang it up
- Put on their coat and fasten it
- Change their shoes
- Dress and undress (including buttons)
- Use a knife and fork
- Use the toilet independently
- Wash and dry hands
- Share toys and take turns
- Help to tidy toys away

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Preparing your child for their first day

- Talk about school in a positive way
- Go shopping together to get things for school
- Allow time for your child to try on their uniform
- Encourage your child to talk to family and friends about starting school
- Plan ahead for changes in routine
- Share books about starting school
- Practise travelling to school together before the big day
