



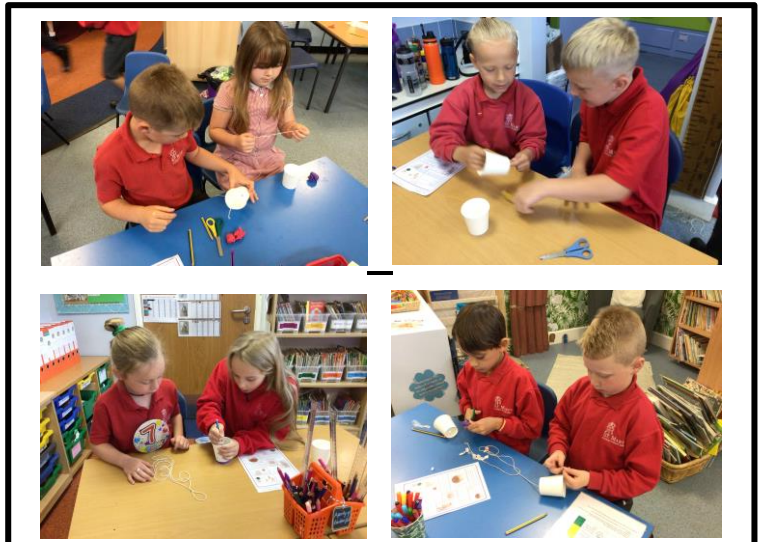

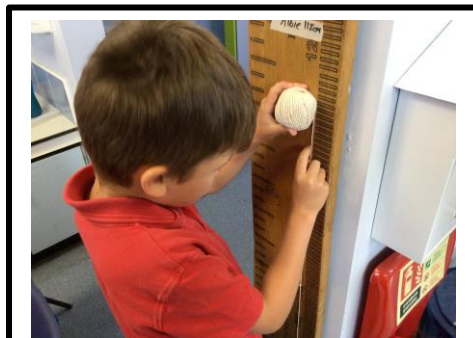
Fishermen Class have been Super Scientists!



Fishermen Class learnt about Alexander Bell and the invention of the telephone. Then they followed instructions to make their own paper cup telephones.



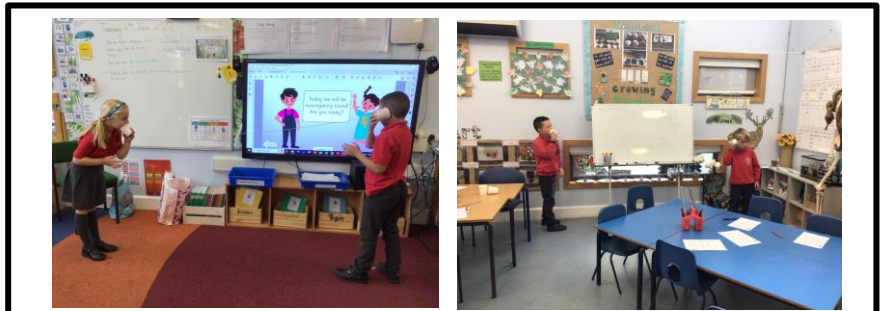
The children helped each other to create each part of their telephone, which including the telephone wire and the receiver.



The children used their measuring skills to make sure they had the right length of string.



They showed great perseverance!



The children worked in pairs to test out their telephones. First one person whispered a secret word into the telephone cup and then, the receiving person had to say what they heard. They then swapped roles.

The children found out that they could hear sound better when the telephone wire was pulled tight. They also found out that they could hear the sound much more clearly when the telephone wire was shorter.

This led to a discussion about making telephone calls around the world and the impact that distance has on the quality of sound during a telephone call!
