Through our teaching, we aim for children to explore THE ARTS using skill or imagination in the creation of aesthetic objects, environments, culture, music or experiences that are shared with others. In doing so, we are contributing to a child's holistic development, INDEPENDENCE and WELLBEING.



Through our teaching we aim to promote RESILIENCE so that the children will become absorbed in what they do and keep on going in the face of difficulties and challenges. Our aim is for children to use their INITIATIVE and REFLET upon previously taught skills and techniques in creating their own unique art; promoting ambition and broadening their future POSSIBILITIES.
