All about safeguarding at St Marys

- Staff training is updated annually including governors and cover supervisors.
- Mrs Concannon and Mrs Morgan have completed the designated safeguarding lead training PREVENT and medical training is completed annually. First Aid training is completed every 3 years
- Internet safety training is completed annually Internet safety is taught termly and we book a number of visitors/ visits to support this.
- An up to date Safeguarding policy can be found on the school website. The Behaviour Policy has been updated with staff
- Termly Safeguarding checks are made and reported to governors All staff and Governors are DBS checked
- A safeguarding audit is completed for the County and for the school annually. The school safeguarding Governor is Mrs Brimson
