St. Mary's on the HS2 Safari

We started the safari by entering the familiar site entrance at Chipping Warden. The children were given a safari sheet to check off the things they would see on our journey. We went as near to the tunnel as we were allowed and we were approx 20 metres deep, the final tunnel will be 1.6km long. The children were told that it is the first tunnel of its kind -ever, so they are learning on the job. We travelled further into their web of internal roads, glimpsing landmarks that we see (Carpenters Arms in Lower Boddington, Washbrook Farm). We also saw the High Furlong viaduct under construction and travelled underneath the new bridge at Lower Boddington. The children learned about the great crested newt fences and the different types of workforce involved in HS2 construction.
