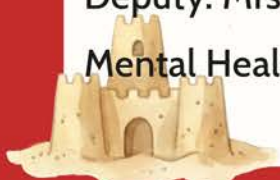

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Dear Parents,

I am writing to draw your attention to the importance of maintaining consistently respectful behaviour on the playground, using appropriate language at all times, and showing courtesy during dismissal times. These expectations are a key part of our school values and help ensure that all pupils feel safe, valued and able to enjoy their time at school.

Recently, we have observed instances of inappropriate behaviour on the playground at pick up and drop off times. We have also noted that behaviour at dismissal times has, on occasion, fallen below the standard we expect, with some pupils not showing the level of respect and cooperation required when leaving school. Such conduct can have a negative impact on others and does not reflect the considerate behaviour we seek to promote.

We understand that children are still developing their social skills and that guidance at home plays an important role in reinforcing expectations. As parents are a child's first teachers, the example set at home plays a vital role in shaping how children speak and behave towards others. In partnership with families, we can help pupils understand the importance of kindness, self-discipline and respect in all aspects of school life. As Scripture reminds us, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6). By working together, we can help pupils understand the importance of speaking respectfully, treating others with kindness and dignity, and following instructions calmly and appropriately, particularly at busy times such as break, lunch and home time.

Please also be aware that the Gate is closed at 3:15pm to ensure a safe site for those attending after school clubs. Your support in discussing these expectations with your child would be greatly appreciated.

We will continue to reinforce these expectations in school and to support pupils in making positive choices. Thank you for your continued cooperation and support in helping us maintain a calm, safe and respectful environment for all.
